

Q5 When was the last time you competed in a Registered Match?


Q6 Should the Nationals be held at the same venue every year?


Q8 If the Nationals were to be held at a single location and not Jim McKinley Range Canberra, What location would you prefer?


Q9 If the Nationals are not changed to be exclusively at the Jim MckInley Range Canberra - Should the current State Rotation system remain





Q11 Should the LB & HB Class be shot on Saturday and Sunday at the Centrefire Nationals with Sporter on Friday and Unlimited on Monday?





Myself being a business owner I'm definitely aware of these problems. Anybody that really knows me knows I'm classed as old school & I'm all for traditional ways of things being done. I also know if it's not working, serious changes need to be made or your just fighting a loosing battle. Some Traditions need to be acknowledged but not at the expense of the sport. They mean nothing if we don't have a Benchrest shooting discipline. To what I see the biggest things with benchrest shooting that influence people's decisions when initially taking the sport up are 1. Affordability, the initial outlay for equipment (which everyone knows who shoots benchrest it's not a cheap sport) & 2. The cost of traveling makes people think it's not the sport for them. Unfortunately we can't change either one of them. 3. Old rules & traditions that aren't suitable for todays times. I'd like to suggest a grading system needs to be implemented which would allow new shooters to be more competitive in their class when they start & will drive them to return & improve so they move up gradings. Gradings seem to work quite well in other disciplines, gets people motivated to do better so I can't see it not working now in benchrest. I think we could also have a look at trialing for maybe 12 -18 months before implementing a customised factory rifle class with no grades in this class. It is a pre requisite really because this is wholly a voluntary sport. Yet the vast majority of participants do not or will not involve themselves. They conveniently ignore it. We are not a professional sport. It it were the shoot entry fees might be \$150 per class. \$600 for a Nationals. Probably like motor sport. If a way forward does not include every person involved consistently in voluntary work then we will not get past 1st Base. It means work in some part of the organisational structure. Committees, Match planing and organisation. Match running, scoring and results service etc. Otherwise I suggest nothing will really move forward anyway. Regardless of new rules or ranges. Fees do strike at the heart for many shooters. Maybe if those who will not work pay 50% more entry fees and those who do have a certain level of involvement get discounted entry fee that may just provide a interesting hip pocket incentive. Otherwise maybe start a 'Benchrest Organisers Union' and just go on strike. Refuse to work and see who takes up the slack. LOL If not, sell the gear and go fishing. We are not the only sport or "club" type activity with this issue of course. A new attitude today wants everything provided for them, when it suits them and ...,then just maybe they might turn up. And also assuming the HOF entry numbers or scores get lowered so they have an easier ride into the HOF. That is not an LOL! I have been trying to analyse for years how to increase numbers and attract more shooters. The competitiveness of the sport these days makes it hard for newcomers, it can take 3-5 years and thousands of dollars in equipment and components in order to get to a competitive standard. The sport is not held in the high regard as it once was, there are many factors to this. SSAA dropping the the benchrest column from their magazine many years ago was the first major nail in the coffin, the limited number of ranges, aging competitors and finding suitable range staff and target crews mean running events falls on fewer and fewer people. It is a real challenge, promoting and supporting the sport isn't as strong as it once was. Whilst centrefire disciplines are declining, others are holding ground and in some cases growing fast and attracting more people to the shooting sports, FLY and rimfire disciplines cases in point. Other newer Disiplines are also proving Popular, I am involved with the Precision Rifle NSW club and they have been going for only 6 months and have 120 financial members. They have been promoted well on social media and are proving to be one of the largest clubs in Australia after only 6 months.

Given that most nationals are now being held on regional ranges that are difficult to get to, the time to travel to a match, plus the time to shoot a match is pretty significant. For example a 4 gun in Springsure is a minimum of 6 days for me. Holding it outside of Easter made it impossible for me to attend. If it was over Easter, and if the light/heavy are held on the Saturday and Sunday, I could at least shoot the 2 gun, and travel the Friday / Monday. I think the rotation of Nationals is an important element of the discipline. I realise the rotation doesnt guarantee a nationals in a different state each year, as it depends on the states ability to host. But at least there tends to be some variability each year. I dont see a need to fully adopt international rules. The only issue I can see would be someone qualifying for the team, but only having gear that didnt qualify for a worlds. But that has never been a limiting factor in almost 30 years of selecting a team. And in that time we are the only country to win a world team or individual title aside from the USA. So I feel what we have works. I believe that people trying to get on the WBC team know what equipment they need to shoot the world match and plan accordingly.
